In partnership with the Guam Police Department- Domestic Assault Response Team (GPD-DART) and the Governor's Community Outreach- Federal Programs Office (GCO-FPO), the Guam Coalition Against Sexual Assault & Family Violence (GCASAFV) and partners cordially invite the public to the Outreach Fair in recognition of **National Slavery and Human Trafficking Prevention Month** (NSHTPM) and **National Stalking Awareness Month** (NSAM).

Governor Lou Leon Guerrero will present the Proclamation for January's NSHTPM and NSAM, and the Legislative Resolution will be presented by the 35th Legislature. GPD, GCO-FPO, GCASAFV, and partners will also provide information and materials on services they provide.

Globally in 2016, nearly 24.9 million human trafficking cases involved sexual exploitation and about 4 million involved labor exploitation. In terms of stalking cases, at least 1 in 6 women and 1 in 17 men have experienced stalking at some point during their lifetime. For January, national and local efforts are aimed at speaking out against and raising awareness on human trafficking, working to prevent stalking, and providing information on services and community awareness.
